Memory Care Reminder: Centennial House strives to provide a safe and secure environment to those with memory impairment by providing two secured memory care areas within our community. In order to ensure appropriate levels of supervision to those who live in our memory care that are escorted to other parts of the building, we ask for your assistance. If you are escorting your loved one to another part of the building or outside to enjoy our patios, please notify one of the Resident Assistants in the area. They will assist you with signing your loved one in and out of the area as well allowing access to other areas of the building, including the secured patio in House 3 memory care. Please share this information with anyone who may be coming to visit our memory care areas.

Also, the staff of Centennial House may escort residents on walks throughout the building or our grounds. Any escort from memory care must be 1 to 1, meaning one staff member or visitor can escort one resident out of the secured area. We appreciate your support with this. If you have questions or concerns, please reach out to me. Our goal is to provide the high level of care and service your loved one deserves, and we always appreciate your feedback.

Ecumen conducts satisfaction surveys of residents and responsible parties on a regular basis. As of May 2019, we will be changing vendors to NRC Health. Each responsible party should have received a form from Centennial House requesting consent for NRC Health to connect with either the resident of Centennial House or the responsible party to conduct periodic surveys. If you haven't returned the consent form, please do so. Your feedback is important to us and is used to enhance your experience at Centennial House.
